STANDARD DIPLOMA PATHWAY GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- English 4 credits
- Math 4 credits(while in HS)
 - Algebra 1 and Geometry required
- Science 4 credits
 - Biology required

- Social Studies 3 specific credits
 - World History (10th grade)
 - American History (11th grade)
 - American Government .5 credit (12th grade)
 - Economics w/ Financial Literacy .5 credit (12th grade)

STANDARD DIPLOMA PATHWAY GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Personal Fitness ½ credit
- Physical Education ½ credit
- Performing/Fine Arts 1 credit
- Electives 9 credits
 - One course must be completed through on-line learning

- G.P.A. must be at least 2.0 unweighted
- Pass FSA ELA Grade 10--Level 3 or higher
- Pass Algebra 1 EOC Level 3 or higher

SCHEDULE CHANGE POLICY

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)

- Students who complete AP courses are:
 - more likely to be accepted at competitive universities
 - better prepared academically
 - more likely to chose challenging majors
 - likely to complete more college work in 4 years
 - likely to perform significantly better than students who did not
 - more likely to exercise leadership
 - more likely to graduate with double majors
 - twice as likely to go into advanced study

AP CAPSTONE DIPLOMA

Ap Seminar

- Grades 10-11
- Foundational course that provides students the opportunity to critically and creatively, research, explore, pose solutions, develop arguments, collaborate.
- Students explore real-world issues
- Assessed through two course performance tasks and a written exam

• AP Research

- Grades 11-12
- Allows students to design, plan and conduct a yearlong research-based investigation on a topic of individual interest
- Students are assess through culminating performance tasks
- Students may be concurrently registered for Biotechnology is their research is science based

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)

- National exam given in May determines whether your score is high enough and your particular college of choice will give you college credit.
- For the college bound student who enjoys challenging and thought provoking curriculum

PROGRAM OF EMPHASIS

Cybersecurity

- Year One: IT Fundamentals
- This course introduces students to the essential concepts, components, terminology, and knowledge about computers, computer systems, peripherals and networks

Culinary Arts

- Year One: Culinary 1 (.5 credit)

I have an older child already in high school. Can they be a part of this program and get the AA degree as well?


