REGISTRATION PROCEDURES:

- Counselors met with students individually to review credits and select courses for next year
- All course changes should be completed prior to the end of the current school year; schedule changes will not be made at the start of the 2019-2020 school year!
- Classes are subject to change based on availability, scheduling, and student's academic performance this year

SUMMER SCHOOL-CREDIT RECOVERY:

- Counselors mailed home summer school applications with deficient courses
- Complete summer school application and return to registration (deadline has passed, please submit ASAP while space is available)
- Two sessions: May 31st-June 12th and/or June 13th-June 27th
- Credit recovery uses Plato program; purpose is to remediate deficiencies in course(s)
- Contact your student's counselor for specifics on courses they may need to take



SUMMER VIRTUAL SCHOOL :

- Seminole County Virtual School, set a start date of June 1st for summer session → open for registration now
 - Virtual school can be used for credit recovery or additional courses; talk to your counselor about the best option for you!
 - Must remain on pace as set by virtual school teacher, courses are structured to take the time they would face-to-face, but may work ahead.



2019-2020 SCHEDULES:

- **Schedule pick-up:**
 - August 1st: grades 9 and 10
 - August 2nd: grades 11 and 12
- Any course request changes should be submitted prior to the end of the school year. A Google Form will be public by May 3rd for students to request changes.
- All modified schedule requests will take place after the above scheduled pick-up dates. Prior to that date, all students must be registered for a full 7.0 credits including all 4.0 core (English, math, science, social studies) classes.



SENIOR TRANSCRIPTS:

- Seniors will receive a Final Transcript Request Form at the Senior Meeting. Students are to fill out the form and submit to Student Services, a final transcript will then be sent to the college of their choice after graduation.
- Transcripts for all seniors who have applied to Bright Futures will be sent in the summer. If your senior retakes the ACT/SAT and becomes eligible for a Bright Futures award, they must come to campus during summer for their transcript to be manually sent.
- Volunteer hours must be submitted to your counselor by May 1st to guarantee they will be on transcript.
